

Religious Education

Our Religious Education unit this term is called, 'Saints'.

In this unit, students will be looking back at the past to help them understand the way they live now.

They will also explore the history of the Catholic church and its saints to deepen their relationship with others and God.

Part of this will be developing our understanding of social justice, Gospel Values and the Habits of the Mind.



To help your child in Religion encourage them to talk about how people can be 'everyday saints', chat about choices that saints in the Bible made. Reflect on good choices and why we make them.

Possible questions to prompt thinking may be:

- What would be a good choice?
- If you choose to _____
 how will it affect other people?
- If you made a different choice what might happen?



English

During Term Four Juniors will be looking at the structure of narratives. This is linked to our Inquiry unit where we will be hearing personal narratives to explore how things have changed throughout history. In addition to this we are also reviewing the purpose and different features of persuasive texts and poetry.

Students are exploring a variety of text types and continuing to use the VCOP wall to uplevel their writing. If you'd like to know more about VCOP, ask your child to show you their Homegroups VCOP wall and ask them how they use it in their writing.



Throughout all curriculum areas we are using THRASS to explore words. In particular looking at base words, the meaning of words, hearing the phonemes and what graphemes are used to represent these.

Our weekly **Big Writes** will be continued every Tuesday. Each junior student keeps this work in their Big Write Display Folder. Students are encouraged to share this work with their parents before and after school.

To help your child in English please ensure you discuss their "talk home learning" with them prior to our weekly Big Writes. Talk home learning will go home every Friday afternoon.



Mathematics

Term four maths will begin by exploring addition and subtraction strategies. We are being challenged by simple maths problems and thinking about the strategies we might use to solve the problem. Once we have



What you can do at home:

Ask your child how they would solve simple addition and subtraction problems and discuss possible, more efficient strategies.

Inquiry

Our Key Understanding for our inquiry in Term four is: Understanding the past impacts present and future.

To narrow down this big idea we will investigate the following smaller concepts:

- How have people and events in the past, impacted our present?
- How will current people and events impact our future?
- What are the skills I need to be curious?
- How can we explore the past?

To support your child before and during this inquiry you might like to:

- Talk about objects from your childhood
- Visit a grandparent and discuss how their childhood was different from today
- Compare toys from the past and present
- Read books from the past and talk about how things are different now
